photocomposition

uses principles such as rule of thirds, repetition, leading lines, framing and other techniques in most photos; photos are cropped carefully

5 points

demonstrates solid principles of composition in some photos but has minor cropping problems or more than two "bad" images

3 points

does not demonstrate rule of thirds or other techniques and/or has noticeable cropping problems or mergers; blurry photos

1 point

feedback

storytelling

represents a wide variety of storytelling angles; specifically shows before/during/after or creative idea with evidence of preplanning; photographer spent the time necessary to tell a story with multiple parts

5 points

shows more than one storytelling angle but most of the shots are from one aspect; shoot lacks depth or would tell a better story with more planning or time on site

3 points

does not document the before during/after of the topic and is noticeably limited in storytelling ability

1 point

angles

shows a variety of wide angle, medium shot and tight or close-up photographs

3 points

shows two of the three: wide angle, medium shot or tight/close-up photographs

2 points

shows angles of only one type: wide, medium or close-up photographs

1 point

format

follows all directions; folder is in correct location on shared drive with correct naming structure from Batch Rename (topic/date/lastname); shoot contains 15-20 color-corrected images for grading

5 points

follows most of the directions lacking in color quality OR naming structure; too many or not enough images submitted

3 points

has multiple format errors from Bridge in terms of color-correcting, folder name, quantity OR images were not processed or edited before submission

0 points

meeting deadlines

is turned in on time

2 points

is turned after the deadline
